Principles of Law for Health and Social Care MSAP4051

You will learn how to locate, read and evaluate law, and will be provided with a variety of opportunities to explore the legal context of contemporary health and social care. Through the course of this module, you will be required to consider how complex, and potentially conflicting issues relating to the service user and the law may impact on the decisions made by yourself and others. This module will include a range of activities to enable you to develop the awareness, knowledge and skills necessary to facilitate evidence based, safe and effective patient-centred care which promotes the service user's dignity and autonomy.
