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# Academic Liaison Librarian appointment guidelines

Academic Liaison Librarians are here to help you use library and information resources effectively and confidently.

#### What we can do

Offer help, training and advice to students and staff undertaking research, independent studies, essays or other projects. This may include:

- A basic introduction to library and information resources
- How to find appropriate databases and resources for your subject
- An explanation of the principles of literature searching
- Advice on referencing software
- Support with understanding and applying University of Worcester referencing styles in assignments (excluding proof-reading of assignments or advice on rewriting of essays)

#### What we can't do

- Conduct your literature search(es) for you
- Offer qualitative assessment of references found through a literature search
- Write or proof-read your work
- Offer feedback on your work or the mark you receive
- Give you advice on essay-writing or other study skills. Please see the <u>University of Worcester study skills pages</u> for advice on these areas, and the <u>University of Worcester support pages</u> for information about other support available including the writer-in-residence and Language Centre
- Provide ongoing individual support



## You should

- Pre-book your appointment with your Academic Librarian, by email or telephone.
  These can be held at a mutually convenient location anywhere on campus or in the
  Hive
- Arrive on time for a pre-arranged session
- Notify your Academic Liaison Librarian as soon as possible if you cannot attend a booked session. It is important that you do this so that the session can be offered to someone else
- Prepare for your session as directed by your Academic Liaison Librarian
- Not expect to have ongoing 1-1 support and tuition from your Academic Liaison
  Librarian
