Call for nominations

The call for nominations for the 2023/24 award is now open

This award is to celebrate the achievements of an individual or team who have shown their ability to implement positive change for people living with dementia.

Who can be nominated?

The Hennell Award is open to anyone who has attended an online or inperson course facilitated by the Association for Dementia Studies. This could include:

- Courses for professional groups or organisations
- The <u>Postgraduate Certificate</u> in Person-Centred Dementia Studies and the individual modules within it
- The **Postgraduate Award** in Professional Development
- The Meeting Centres Training Course
- Championing Physical Activity course

Nominations can be made by self, colleagues, course tutors or any individuals or carers affected by dementia.

The judges base their decisions on the narrative provided on the Nomination Form and supporting information and evidence.

- Say why you think this change should win the award, for example is it new and innovative or perhaps a transfer of good practice into a new setting?
- Include any details of how other staff have benefitted or learned from the initiative.
- Describe particular barriers which had to be overcome to achieve a positive outcome and how this was achieved.

Please use sufficient detail so that the judges can make an assessment of the type of initiative, its impact on people living with dementia and whether the initiative is replicable elsewhere. Please also provide supporting information and evidence (e.g. written testimonials from other professionals and family members, copies of paperwork they have modified, specific examples of the work they have done, photographs of improved environments, resources and activities, etc.). Information about individuals must be anonymised and consent gained for any photographs.

Supporting information should be scanned or photographed and attached to a covering email with your nomination form. Information received after the closing date will not be considered. The judges' decision is final and communication about the outcome will not be entered into.
