

Introduction to Clinical Assessment of the Adult Patient/Client

5 day skills workshop

As healthcare provision changes to meet the needs of the population, practitioners are crossing professional boundaries to meet these demands. Health Assessment whether comprehensive or focussed, forms the basis of clinical decision-making, and every patient/practitioner contact is an opportunity for assessment.

This 5 day workshop enables practitioners to explore and enhance their knowledge and skills in the performance of health assessment within the context of professional practice.

Target Audience:

Registered nurses or Allied Health professionals with a minimum of 12 months post registration experience. Practitioners should be in a position that involves direct contact with patients.

All practitioners should have a good knowledge of anatomy and physiology as this is not covered within the course content.

Following this workshop support in the workplace with an experienced practitioner is strongly recommended.

This workshop does not equip students with any competence therefore anyone working in an advanced health practitioner role must undertake a formal health assessment module.

Aim

To provide the participant with an overview of the principles of history taking and physical examination.
