

The normal development of human activity, that can be carried on long-term without damaging impacts. Unfortunately, this largely is non-existent, because industries are dominated by a handful of global monopolies. A classic example is farming - in the UK, we till the soil way too much and cause the disruption of the natural biology, spray deadly poisons that cause cancer, alzheimer's and genital deformities to get rid of weeds, and then fertilise with factory-produced chemical fertilisers, missing the broad range of necessary micronutrients which would come from animal manure or seaweed sources. Then someone in the food industry wants to make more money so they promote veganism/plant-based diets - one of the most environmentally damaging diets which "requires" more tillage, more land for foods long considered unfit for human consumption i.e. soya, or insane amounts of water i.e. avocadoes, and the diet does not provide everything the human body requires.






I try to make an active effort in my life to be as environmentally-conscious as possible. It has shaped by education in the topic of my dissertation and the subject of the Master's i want to study.






(Encouraged you to think and act to help the environment, and other people the most?)
