

Newborn Physical Examination MACP4011

This module provides the opportunity for midwives, nurses and allied health professionals to come together to extend their knowledge of newborn physiology and gain the competence to carry out a full newborn physical examination as required by the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities Newborn and Infant Physical Examination Standards (2021). There is a growing need for registered midwives, nurses and other allied health professionals to extend their role in the field of newborn examination and screening for health. In extending their field of practice, midwives, nurses and allied health professionals will, upon completion of the module, be able to offer informed choice and satisfaction for women, birthing people and families.

Assessment:

Critical reflective essay discussing a case taken from practice (2,000 words)

Observed structured clinical examination (30 minutes)

Completed practice competency document including 15 completed Newborn and Infant Physical Examination assessments.
