Money Advice Team

Provide students, and potential students, with welfare and financial advice and support.

- Arrange a telephone appointment to speak to a Money Adviser
- Provide information and advice about eligibility and applying for the Access to Learning Fund (ALF)
- Find tips and advice on budgeting and financial advice from the <u>Money Advice</u> website



Disability and Dyslexia Service (DDS)

Supporting students who have a disability, medical condition or Specific Learning Difficulty (SpLD) including dyslexia.

- Book a telephone advisory appointment with a Disability Adviser - discuss learning support, assessments and Disability Support Allowance
- Explain the SpLD/dyslexia assessment process if you are able to visit Worcester
- You may be able to access a diagnostic assessment closer to where you are studying-reimbursement costs may be available





Counselling and Mental Health Team

Supporting students experiencing emotional or psychological problems, so that they can gain maximum benefit from their university experience and develop their potential to the full.

- Provide advice on accessing the service and support available
- Counselling appointments can be by telephone
- If you have a Disability Support Allowance with a counselling element, you will receive this locally
- Self help documents and resources can be found on their webpages





Careers and Employability Service

Works with students, graduates, employers and colleagues, supporting students in the planning and management of their employability skills.

- Provide advice on the service and how to book an appointment with a careers adviser
- Appointments can be by telephone or Skype and are also available after your studies finish
- Register for the <u>Worcester Award</u> to record extra activities you take part in during your studies
- Access on line resources and psychometric tests







Study Skills and Library Services

- Access on-line Study Skills resources
 - Study Skills advice sheets: organisation, taking notes, essay writing, revision, minimising stress, using feedback etc.
 - **Resources:** academic writing, assessment advice, critical thinking etc.
- Use the Library Services
 - <u>On-line study skills</u>: referencing, plagiarism, finding sources, evaluating sources
 - <u>Use the Academic Liaison Librarian contacts</u> for subject guides and reading lists
