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The University of Worcester is a campus university, meaning everything you need is on site. We have three main campuses around the city, all within easy walking distance.

Worcester is a cathedral city in the West Midlands, to the south of Birmingham and north of Bristol.

It has three train stations and is just off the M5 motorway, meaning it's easy to get to from lots of different locations.

TRAVELLING TO WORCESTER



There are regular and direct trains from Birmingham, Hereford, Bristol, Oxford, London and many other places. Then from Foregate Street station, in the centre of Worcester, you can either hop on a bus or walk to our campuses.

If you're driving, Worcester – located just off the M5 motorway – is about 40 minutes south of Birmingham and an hour north of Bristol.

We have plenty of on-campus parking with term-time permits available from just over £100 for the year.

Worcester city is known for its friendly atmosphere, historic buildings, independent cafés and shops, and of course the world-famous Worcestershire Sauce!

The city's history gives it a unique character, with restaurants in timber-framed Tudor houses and coffee shops under Victorian railway arches. Alongside beautiful parks and riverside walks, it has everything you'd expect from a busy modern city.

Everything is easily accessible on foot, and there are good transport links if you're commuting.

And if you want to explore at the weekends, you have two areas of outstanding natural beauty on your doorstep – the Malvern Hills and the Cotswolds.







The university has around **10,000 students, including 1,500 international students, studying across three campuses.**

St John's Campus – our original home – is based in a friendly residential community and is just a 15-minute walk away from our City Campus, which is in the heart of the city. Severn Campus is located between St John's and City Campus.

We also have our Lakeside outdoor education centre, which is a 10-minute drive from Worcester.

Our campuses are within easy walking or wheeling distance of the city centre.

There are plenty of popular student spots to visit, including some of the independent cafés, restaurants and shops highlighted on this map.

There's plenty of accommodation on our St John's and City campuses, meaning you can quickly pop to the on-site canteen, shop and launderette – and it's a short walk to classes.

You can choose from several types of accommodation, ranging from traditional halls with shared facilities to large ensuite rooms. All rooms are fully furnished and you'll benefit from on-site maintenance and 24-hour security.

There are no extra charges for gas, water, electricity or Wi-Fi - these are all covered by your accommodation costs. You'll even get free gym membership!

Every one of our residential rooms built this century have been designed to accommodate a wheelchair turning circle.

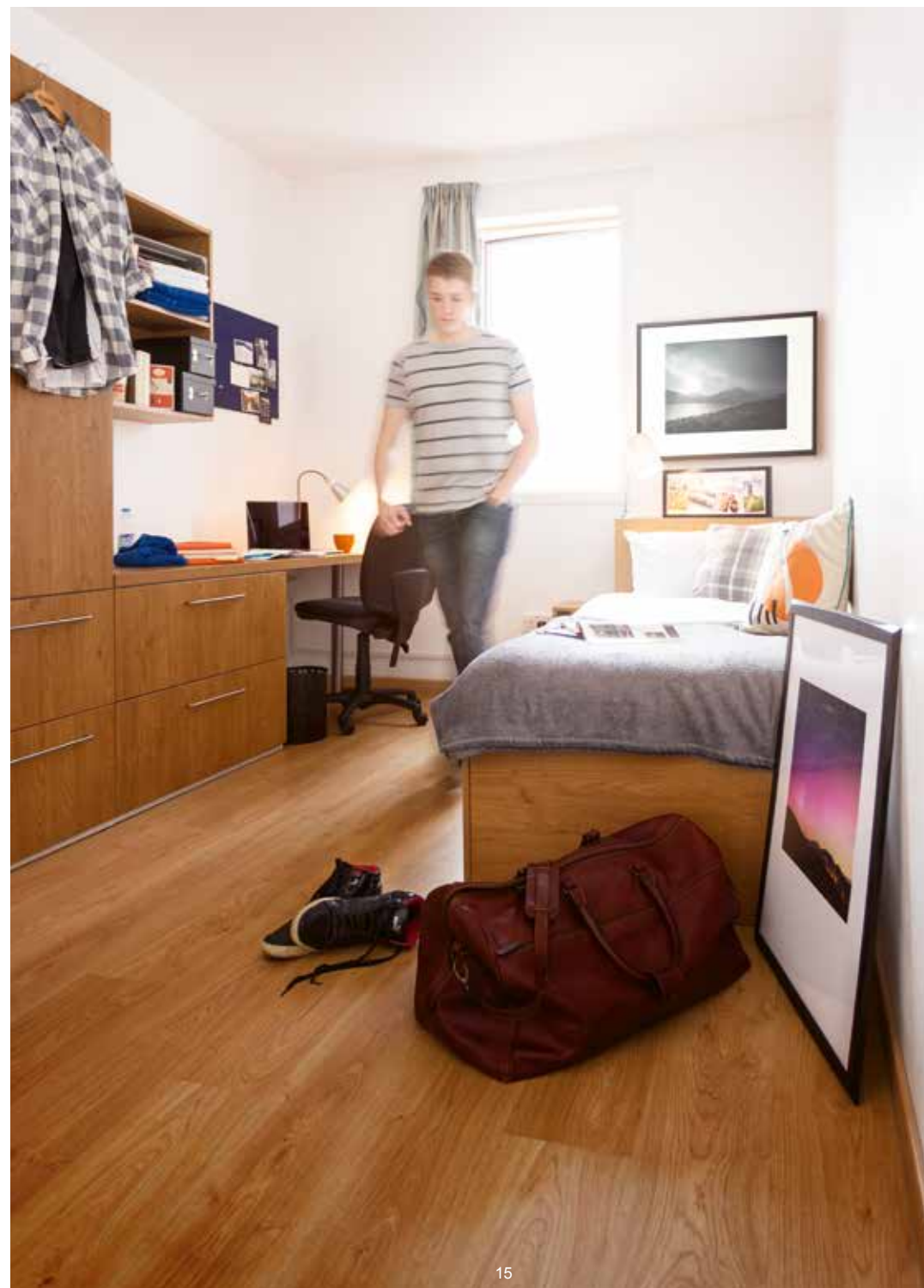

University isn't all about study, it's also somewhere you'll make new friends.

You can make friends on your course or in Halls of Residence, but also by joining a sports club or society.

These groups are run by the Students' Union (SU) which is an independent organisation there to represent and support you. When you study on any course at the University of Worcester you'll automatically become a member of the Worcester SU, and you can join any club or society you like.

You might want to try archery, American football, or ultimate frisbee; or you might prefer the Book Club, D&D Society or Knit 'n' Knatter group. And if you can't find an existing club or society to match your interests, it's easy to start your own.

Heading off to university may be the first time you've been in full control of your money. **Don't worry. If you need it, we'll be there to offer support.**

Your university education isn't funded by the government in the same way it is when you're in school or college. Instead, you'll pay tuition fees. We use these fees to cover lectures, seminars and tutorials, access to facilities, support services, and all other course costs.

On-campus paid work

There are paid employment opportunities available through our Earn as You Learn scheme, including becoming a Student Ambassador.

This role means you'll get paid for helping the University at events such as Open Days and with other tasks during the year.

You can sign up for the shifts you want, making it a great option to earn some extra money alongside your studies.

When you decide you want to go to university, you'll apply through UCAS.

UCAS is the organisation that manages full-time undergraduate course applications in the UK.

Here are the key steps you'll take:

1. Research courses and universities

Look at university websites for the most up-to-date and detailed information. You can also use the UCAS website and sites like WhatUni to shortlist and compare courses at different universities.

This research phase is a great time to start going to Open Days and thinking about which university is a good fit for you.

2. Register on the UCAS website

Once you've got a few universities and courses in mind, go to the UCAS Hub (www.ucas.com/hub) and complete the registration. They ask questions like "what year do you want to start?" and "what level do you want to study?" to help you consider your options.

3. Make your course choice

You can apply for up to five courses on your application. There's no need to rank your choices at this stage. You are able to apply for several courses at the same university, if you wish.

4. Draft your personal statement

This generally takes the form of a short, reflective piece of writing about why you've applied for the course and why the university should offer you a place. Don't worry! We can help you with this. You can book a 10-minute one-to-one slot with one of our advisors at an Open Day to talk through your personal statement draft.

5. Submit your application

UCAS applications are generally submitted between the start of September and the end of January. It's a good idea to ask someone else to check your application before you submit it.

6. Track and respond to your offers

Use the UCAS Hub to see any offers as soon as they're made, and reply to them when you're ready. The site will guide you through the different types of offers and response deadlines.

Once you've received your offers, you'll decide on a first and second choice (known as firm and insurance choices).

You'll be spending the next three years of your life at university (if you're looking to study a full-time degree) so it's worth taking your time to make the decision.

At an Open Day, you can meet your future lecturers and find out more about the course you're interested in.

You'll get the chance to chat with current students while they take you on a tour of the campus and the accommodation.

It's also the perfect opportunity to head into the city.

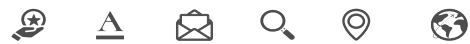

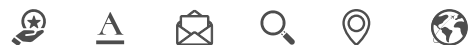

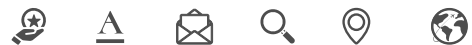
