## Reach Scheme

Reach is an innovative programme for University of Worcester students. Reach will help you make the very best of your time at the University of Worcester by improving access to the learning tools you need to support your studies.

For the 2018-19 academic year, full-time home and EU undergraduate and PGCE students paying the £9,250 tuition fee will receive a reach award to spend in the online shop on a wide range of useful items. Students in the first year will receive £100 credit and students in other years will receive £50 credit.

## £1,000 Academic Achievement Scholarships

The University awards scholarships of £1000 to eligible undergraduate students in their first and second year of a degree course or first year of a Foundation degree or HND on the basis of their academic achievement at the University. Students do not apply for these scholarships as they are awarded to eligible students with the best academic profiles across the University.

## £2,000 Choral Scholarships

In partnership with Worcester Cathedral, Choral Scholarships are available to young men with counter-tenor, tenor and baritone/ bass voices and are aimed at encouraging young singers to become part of the long-standing tradition of Cathedral Music, while pursuing a course of study. The scholarships are available to students in the first, second or third year of an undergraduate course.

Scholars will receive £2,000, paid in instalments over 12 months, private singing tuition and support from a Principal Lay Clerk. In addition to regular services, the post will give an opportunity to sing with the Cathedral Choir in concerts, recordings, tours and the world famous Three Choirs Festival, for which additional remuneration will be paid.
